Net-Neutrality: The Voice of Libraries. Dr. Rajesh Kr. Bhardwaj

What is Net-Neutrality?

Network Neutrality (or "net" neutrality) is the concept of free accessing or providing the Internet content and services without any discrimination, prejudice, boundaries, auditing, supervision, regulations, or controlling. The basic principle is to extend the information and services online without any third party auditing. Thus, social reformers, educator, information aggregators or providers who may be individual



citizens, libraries, schools, or nonprofit organisations offer online content or services through their website or portal in the interest of society at large. Apart from the social causes, many individuals or companies which are engaged in business, trade, or commercial activities provide their services and information through the internet.

What are the issues of Net Neutrality?

Net neutrality is the fundamental principle of the Internet. The access of internet reaches to user through both the "common carrier" laws that have long governed the phone lines used for both voice telephony and dial up access. But, many clients receive broadband service over other technologies that are not subject to the same common-carriage requirements. This is to mention here that these technologies are undoubtedly much better to dial-up. Lack of enforceable net neutrality principles concerns us. The Cable and DSL (Digital Subscriber Line) companies are planning to partner in "bit discrimination" by extending high speed connectivity to websites and services on the basis of some regular premium or by preferring their own business associates when delivering content or service. Now the issue is that whether we should accept of paying some premium to access the website to get faster

connectivity or maintain the status quo to access the free internet and websites at the existing connectivity speed. The facebook has also joined hands with these companies and launched internet.org to promote the idea of paid internet services.

The impact of Net Neutrality on Library and Information Centres

Libraries are the natural source of information whether the information is in print for or in digital form, there is no barrier in between user and library, whether the delivery is manual or through digital carrier. The information which is in possession of libraries will not be as easy to share as practiced in present digital environment. The role of libraries in the freedom of expression in the domain of content is widely accepted.

We believe in the freedom of libraries and librarians which are equally important to extend innovative new kinds of library and information services and play proactive role in the growth and development of our democratic society. The libraries are not as commercial enterprises. The libraries are the source of natural oxygen to the knowledge society or information fuel to the mind of intellectuals. It is therefore no one including government has the right to create hurdle in between library and its users.

On the other hand, all citizens have the right to be well informed and consume the relevant content for their individual growth in respect of education and research. It is the right of all peoples to seek and receive content from all sources without any restrictions.

The debate and point of view from libraries

The debate on this issue is going on; the pro Net Neutrality people have their own concerns and produce logical facts in favour of their stand.

- Today, we are living in the global family and internet played a great role in connecting people of diverse geographical, languages, political, or ideological origins, religions, social backgrounds, etc.
- It helps a lot in understanding the values of the human being across the globe and developing an international culture and conscious theory of co-existence.
- It greatly enhanced everyone's ability to inform, share and understand both themselves and others.
- The modern thoughts, values, theories and practices are replacing the old, unwanted and discarded rituals. World communities are sharing their good culture, social values which widely accepted by the other social sectors.
- The online education including library and information science is delivered to the students without any barrier and it needs unrestricted delivery.
- The latest inventions, innovations and knowledge has been shared immediately among the groups will not be as easy if net neutrality is deprived.
- The concept of internet was never been thought as a commercial activity and it needs to be maintained with the same spirit in future. While, the scientists behind the internet and www innovations were not in favour of its commercialization and applied for their patents, then these business companies have no moral values to convert the Internet as a commercial activity.
- Internet is the part of technological developments and putting any kind of restrictions on it means putting restriction on the social developments.
- Internet extends the opportunity to connect directly knowledge creator to knowledge seeker, innovator to implementer, teacher to student and content buyer to seller, etc.
- Many libraries are engaged in collecting, managing, creating and disseminating necessary content to the public over the Internet, and to ensure their users are able to access the Internet and Net neutrality is very much required to meet the mission in serving nations and communities at large.

The restriction on free flow of content via internet is not acceptable in any condition and we feel that it is the direct attack on libraries freedom which will create a huge gap in civilized society and blocks natural source of content. Therefore, libraries should support Net Neutrality legislation that preserves the competitive online markets for content and services. The Bandwidth for connectivity and access needs to be offered on equal terms to all willing to pay. Else, broadband providers are free to leverage their quasi-monopolies into lucrative but market-distorting agreements. The libraries around the world are trying to protect and promote the Net Neutrality and related laws that help to preserve and retain the rights of all Internet content providers and its users.

Digitization of Hardayal Municipal Public Library

Tribune News Service, New Delhi, August 28

The Delhi Urban Heritage Foundation has been entrusted with the task to look into the restoration of the Hardayal Municipal Public Library's outer and inner structure. The library authority has directed the library to undertake an assessment for optimal utilisation of its assets, staff and finances.

The Commissioner (North MCD), representatives from South and East MCDs, secretary, librarian and senior officials of the government have discussed the renovation and digitisation plan of the library.

Lt Governor of Delhi Dr. Najeeb Jung has sanctioned a one-time grant of three crore rupees to historic Hardayal Municipal Public Library for revamping of its infrastructure and digitisation developments of the library.

The LG has issued directions that a joint inspection team should be constituted immediately to undertake the course of action, i.e., removal of encroachment, restoration, renovation and digitisation of rare and old books in the library's collection".

Expansion of Hardayal Municipal Public Library

The Leader of Opposition in Delhi Legislative Assembly Sh. Vijender Gupta has inaugurated a new branch of the historic Hardayal Municipal Public Library in Brahmapuri area in east Delhi.

East Delhi Mayor Sh. Harshdeep Malhotra said that the library is an asset of society and soon a branch of the old Hardayal library would be started at the East Delhi Municipal Corporation (EDMC) headquarters in Udyog Sadan too. He further said that the Brahampuri branch will be enriched with technical books for engineering and nursing and this library will also facilitate e-library services. The students of engineering and nursing of this area will benefit a lot.

Gita written in Gold Ink by Muslim artist

Indian Express, Surat, August 15, 2015

A copy of Bhagwad Gita written in "gold" ink contains 168 pages by a 75-year-old Sh. Mohammed Yunus Shaikh from Surendranagar. He took help from his family members, sons Mehmood (32) and Yasin (30) and their wives Kashmira and Hasina, respectively to write 745 shlokas of Gita in Sanskrit using ink, prepared by melting gold bars. The book has been completed in two months. The Bhagwad Gita was written on the order of a Jain priest Sh. Vijay Abhaydev Sureshvarji in August 2015 which has been presented to RSS chief Sh. Mohan Bhagwat.

DLISC-KSWU Initiated Recycle and Earn

Karnataka State Women's University (KSWU), Vijayapura has set up a waste paper recycling unit with the aim of protecting the environment. It will provide chance only to learn the skills of waste paper recycling, but can also establish one such unit in the future to generate employment. Dr. Shantidevi. T, department of library and information science and co-ordinator of the unit said that the University provides training and certificate free of cost to those interested in learning the process. Elaborating on the aspects of training, she said that out of the 15 days of training, four days are meant for theory, during which topics such as entrepreneurship, communication skills and loan facilities from the bank will be explained to the women. She said that though the training is offered to women irrespective of their caste or qualification, it was made clear that it will be offered only to a group of 30. Stating that each unit requires at least Rs. Six lakh investment, she said that any Self Help Group (SHG) could start the unit for preparing envelopes, folders, writing papers, visiting/invitation cards and files using waste paper. The loan facility would help trainees to avail financial assistance from the banks to start their own unit."
